Background:

On April 4th, 2022, the City of Gulf Breeze (the "City") and the Capital Trust Agency (the "Agency") entered into Joint Resolution 07-2022 describing the process by which the Agency would transfer funds to the City. Section 2 of the aforementioned resolution defines the process of setting a minimum amount to be held at the Agency.

Section 2. Minimum Amount to be kept in CTA custody.

- a. Beginning in FY 2021-22 and each fiscal year thereafter, the CTA shall submit as part of the CTA budget to the City, a proposed Minimum Amount.
- b. The City shall adopt the Minimum Amount unless the City Council votes to adopt an alternate Minimum Amount and the City Council makes a factual finding that the alternate Minimum Amount will not have a materially adverse effect on the operations of the CTA and the City gives the CTA written notice of such alternate Minimum Amount within thirty (30) days of the vote establishing the alternate Minimum Amount.

Recommendation:

Agency staff recommends the Board provides a proposed Minimum Amount of \$800,000 to the City Council for their consideration on 9-19-22 at 5:50PM. The City has requested a payment of \$1,000,000 for FYE 9-30-2023. The budget adopted by the Agency on August 11 reflects a transfer from reserves of \$372,980. The Agency's cash reserves at the end of 9-30-2023 is still expected to be in excess of \$4,000,000.

JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 07-2022

A JOINT RESOLUTION BETWEEN THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GULF BREEZE, FLORIDA AND THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE CAPITAL TRUST AGENCY; PROVIDING FOR RATIFICATION OF THE CAPITAL TRUST AGENCY AS THE CUSTODIAN OF NET PROFITS AS DEFINED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR A MINIMUM AMOUNT AS DEFINED HEREIN TO BE KEPT IN THE CUSTODY OF THE CAPITAL TRUST AGENCY; PROVIDING FOR PROCEDURES FOR THE CITY OF GULF BREEZE, FLORIDA ANY AND ALL NET PROFITS AS DEFINED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND A REPEALER CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Gulf Breeze, Florida (the "City") is a municipal corporation of the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Trust Agency (the "CTA") is a legal entity and public agency of the State of Florida, organized and existing under the provisions of Chapter 163, Part I, Chapter 166, Part II, and Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, as amended; Ordinance No. 05-97 duly enacted by the City on July 7, 1997, as amended, restated and supplemented by Ordinance Nos. 04-00, 05-01 and 10-11 duly enacted on May 15, 2000, May 7, 2001 and September 6, 2011, respectively; Ordinance No. 2-00, duly enacted by the Town of Century, Florida ("Town") on August 7, 2000, as amended and supplemented by Ordinance Nos. 1-01 and 5-11 duly enacted on May 7, 2001 and October 3, 2011, respectively, and an Interlocal Agreement, dated as of August 2, 1999, between the City and the Town, as amended and supplemented; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Section IX. 1. of Articles of Incorporation of CTA, as amended, all net profits of CTA shall enure to the benefit of the City ("Net Profits"); and

WHEREAS, that as a matter of practice since the inception of CTA, CTA has acted as the custodian of the Net Profits until directed by the City to deliver any and all Net Profits from CTA to the City; and

WHEREAS, the September 2020 State Auditor General's report on its Operations Audit of the City of Gulf Breeze recommended that the City establish formal directives on the transfer of funds from CTA to the City; and

WHEREAS, The City and CTA desire to ratify CTA as the custodian of the Net Profits, to set a minimum amount of the Net Profits to be kept in CTA custody to meet minimum operating needs of the CTA ("Minimum Amount") and to memorialize procedures for the City to direct the delivery of any or all Net Profits from CTA to the City.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY AND CTA:

Section 1. CTA as Custodian of Net Profits.

It is hereby ratified by the City and CTA that CTA shall continue to be the custodian of the Net Profits.

Section 2. Minimum Amount to be kept in CTA custody.

- a. Beginning in FY 2021-22 and each fiscal year thereafter, the CTA shall submit as part of the CTA budget to the City, a proposed Minimum Amount.
- b. The City shall adopt the Minimum Amount unless the City Council votes to adopt an alternate Minimum Amount and the City Council makes a factual finding that the alternate Minimum Amount will not have a materially adverse effect on the operations of the CTA and the City gives the CTA written notice of such alternate Minimum Amount within thirty (30) days of the vote establishing the alternate Minimum Amount.

Section 3. Procedures for the City to direct the delivery of any or all Net Profits from CTA to the City.

- a. If the City desires that CTA deliver any or all Net Profits from CTA to the City, the City Council shall vote at a regular or special meeting of the City Council to send a written notice to CTA directing the CTA to deliver a sum from the Net Profits to the City within sixty (60) days of the City Council vote.
- b. Within thirty (30) days, the Board of Directors of the CTA shall hold a meeting to consider recommendations to the City, if any, about the proposed sum to be delivered to the City from the Net Profits.
 - (i) If the Board of Directors of the CTA fails to timely convene a meeting or has no recommendations to the City about the proposed sum to be delivered to the City from the Net Profits, CTA shall deliver to the sum from Net Profits within the time frame set forth in in sub-section 3.a. herein.
 - (ii) If the Board of Directors of the CTA has recommendations to the City about the sum to be delivered to the City from the Net Profits, CTA shall so advise the City in writing of the recommendation within ten (10) days after the meeting of the Board of Directors of the CTA.
- c. The City Council shall consider the recommendations of the Board of Directors of the CTA at the City Council's next regularly scheduled meeting after receipt of said recommendations. The City Council may accept or reject said recommendations, in whole or in part, and shall provide written notice of the City Council decision to the CTA within ten (10) days of said City Council meeting. and of the sum of Net Profits, if any, to be delivered to the City by CTA, which shall be delivered to the City within thirty (30) days of the said written notice.

Section 4. Severability.

In case any one or more of the provisions of this Joint Resolution shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions of this Joint Resolution and they shall be construed and enforced without consideration of such illegal or invalid provisions.

Section 5. Repeal.

All provisions of resolutions of the City and CTA in conflict with the provisions of this Joint Resolution are, to the extent of such conflict, superseded and repealed.

Section 6. Effective Date.

This Joint Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City.
